EASTER TRADITIONS

One of my treasured memories of my dear maternal grandmother was her love of baking and preparing the special foods for the family gathering on Easter Sunday, especially the baking of the Paska, the Easter bread that represents the Lord Jesus, the Bread of Life. My grandmother's house was filled with the fragrance of delicious baked bread and so many other amazing Slovak pastries.

The making of the Easter cheese (Sirecz or Hrudka) was another Easter tradition. The Easter cheese is similar to a sweet custard. I remember the mixture of scrambled eggs being placed in cheesecloth and tied over the kitchen faucet to catch any of the whey drippings. It would remain there for a couple of hours before being refrigerated. It would be sliced and served at the Easter meal along with the traditional ham, kielbasa, and beets with horseradish.

All of these traditional foods carry rich and symbolic meanings for us. For example, butter in the shape of a lamb reminds us of the goodness of the Lord that we should have for all things. Beets with horseradish serve to remind us of the bitterness of the Passion of Christ. Eggs symbolize the new life and Jesus' resurrection. Ham reminds us of joy and abundance. And the sweet pastries remind us of the promise of eternal life or good things to come.



Rev. Dianiska District to Celebrate 80th Anniversary

The Rev. Dianiska District, Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania, will be 80 years old in 2023! The District was founded in 1943 by Gabrielle Vavrek, the National President of the LPSCU from 1931-1956. Mrs. Vavrek was a member of Saint Stephen's Roman Catholic Church in Plymouth, Pennsylvania, and named the District after her pastor, Rev. Dr. Alexander Dianiska.

Born in Austria-Hungary on March 21, 1867, Rev. Dr. Dianiska immigrated to the United States in 1903. He was a very prominent Slovak priest who aided men and women financially to achieve an education. Along with others, Rev. Dr. Dianiska was instrumental in establishing the congregation of the Sisters of Saints Cyril and Methodius in Danville, Pennsylvania.

The Rev. Dianiska District of the LPSCU is very proud of its Slovak heritage and grateful for the efforts of Mrs. Vavrek and Rev. Dr. Dianiska in forming our District. Membership is open

Cooking Corner

CHICKEN POT PIE

1 medium onion* 2-3 whole carrots* 1-2 stalks celery* 1-2 cups green beans* Mushrooms, to your liking* Garlic, to your liking Pillsbury refrigerated pie crust Pillsbury Biscuits 1/3 cup flour

2 cups cooked. shredded chicken breasts 6 Tbsp. butter 1 cup chicken broth 1 cup frozen peas Salt & pepper to taste

*Vegetables can be either diced or sliced, depending on whether you want a thinner or chunkier consistency.

Melt the butter in a medium size pot. Add onion. carrots, celery, and green beans until cooked. Add mushrooms and garlic; cook until mushrooms turn translucent. Add flour and continue stirring; do not let mixture sit. Add chicken broth and bring to a boil. Continue to heat until mixture becomes thick and gravy-like. Add chicken and peas. Simmer for 10 to 15 minutes.

Roll out pie crust. Place in a pie plate. Fill pie crust with filling mixture from above and bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Cut each biscuit into 3 or 4 pieces and place on top of pie. Return to oven and bake for another 8 to 10 minutes, until biscuits are golden brown.



And even though it's been years since I've done any new eggs, I can still tell you the story behind each one.

Then there are all of the different variations of chocolate dipped candy eggs. Peanut butter eggs, coconut cream eggs, butter cream eggs, milk chocolate, dark chocolate, rolled in crushed peanuts. So many choices! That's another memory I have – making homemade chocolate peanut butter eggs with my sister. I can still see us experiencing our own version of the "I Love Lucy" chocolate candy making episode. It brought tears

of laughter to me decades ago and does to this day as well. We have Cadbury Brothers to thank for coming up with the idea of dipping candy into melted chocolate.

Who doesn't like paska bread? When I was growing up, Easter was the only time of year we made bread and I remember my sister and I making paska bread. The best part for me was when we got to punch the bread and then wait for it to rise again. Finding a good recipe or bakery that makes tasty paska bread is a bit of trial and error. You want the bread to be sweet, but not too sweet. Personally, I like mine with raisins too!

And what about specialty foods during Lent? Many of the fire companies around where I live have special food sales on Fridays during Lent. There are plenty of locations to find homemade haluski, pierogies, and stove rags (lokshe). I hadn't heard of stove rags until recently, but they have quickly become a favorite of mine. For those of you who aren't familiar, stove rags are basically mashed potatoes and flour mixed together and rolled very, very thin and then browned on each side. They can be eaten cold, warm, with butter, or with fruit. If you Google "stove rags" several recipes will pop up. They got their name because initially when people made them, they would "brown" them on top of the coal stove they used to heat their home. And since they were rolled so thin, they looked like rags – hence the name.

Bottom line, it doesn't matter what your Easter traditions are, because they are unique to you and your family. Where you live and who you live with may change over time, but those traditions and memories will stay with you for a lifetime.

LPSCU 10 Payment Life Insurance Plan

The LPSCU offers an economic and beneficial 10 Payment Life Insurance Plan for anyone from age 0 to 75. Under this plan, there is a minimum purchase requirement of life insurance. For those ages 0-70, the minimum purchase amount is \$5,000; for ages 71-75, the minimum purchase amount is \$2,000. Premiums are payable for ten (10) years from issue date. APRIL National Parkinson's Awareness Month

April is designated as National Parkinson's Awareness Month. The purpose of a month specifically dedicated to Parkinson's awareness is to provide an opportunity and platform to increase awareness of the disease and its symptoms and to offer support to those suffering from this condition.

Parkinson's Disease (PD) is a long-term disorder that affects a person's central nervous system. Symptoms can include tremors, movement and balance difficulties, and limb rigidity. Unfortunately, there is currently no cure for Parkinson's, although the disease may be managed with the help of medications

As with all caregivers, those dealing with a loved one who has Parkinson's also need help. It can be as simple as offering to sit with a Parkinson's patient so their caregiver can be free to run errands and not have to worry about their loved one being alone.

I know first-hand how Parkinson's can affect someone. My mom suffered from this disease for thirty-six years. I saw how the illness chipped away at her mobility over time. I can also attest that her taking the daily medication specifically for this disease did in fact slow its progression. She read about every new study, potential new drug, and exercise that claimed they could help. There wasn't an exercise or food that she didn't try to help slow the progression. When my mom was officially diagnosed with PD, she didn't want to tell anyone. But as time went on, she realized that she could help other PD patients with the insights and techniques she had learned along the way, so she willingly shared her story.

Bottom line, just "be"... in whatever capacity you can be. Workforce employee, donor, volunteer, caregiver, patient... you never know whose life will change for the better because of you.

- Be active in parish/diocesan/campus ministry as a lector, extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, adult altar server, catechist/aide, member of parish RCIA/C Team, youth minister, member of the Parish Pastoral Council, Finance Council, and/or other parish committees or organizations.
- Provide a Sponsor Eligibility Form from their parish to show they are active Catholics.
- Be active in an organization or activity that promotes awareness of our Slovak heritage, culture, and traditions.
- Be endorsed by his or her pastor and LPSCU Branch Secretary, with additional endorsement provided by campus minister, youth minister or pastoral associate.
- Attend (or will attend) an accredited college/university as a full time student.
- Provide a notice of acceptance or tuition receipt for the coming scholastic year.
- Provide a wallet-size color photo.

Good Friday ~ Veľký Piatok



Good Friday is a crucial day of the year because it celebrates what we believe to be the most momentous weekend in the history of the world. Ever since Jesus died and was raised, Christians have proclaimed the cross and resurrection of Jesus to be the decisive turning point for all creation.

In Slovak churches, The Burial of Our Lord is a rite celebrated during the Good Friday services. After the Communion rite, the Blessed Sacrament is processed to a side

altar, which is transformed into the tomb of Our Lord. Our Lord is shown, resting in death, and is surrounded by flowers and candles.



On Good Friday, people observe various rituals. One of the most interesting rituals observed on the day is using garlic to ward off evil. According to the popular belief, witches, evil souls, and warlocks can cause possible harm to the humans, cattle, food and farms. To do away with the evil, people eat garlic and even offer it to their cattle.



How to make Marbled Easter Eggs

- Boiled eggs
- Warm water
- Distilled white vinegar
- Food coloring
- Vegetable oil
- 1 container for each color
- 1. The first round of dipping colors is made by stirring 1 teaspoon vinegar and 5-10 drops of food coloring into each cup of water. For best results, these colors should be lighter shades.
- 2. Place one egg in each color and allow to rest, completely covered by the dye, for 1 to 3 minutes. Transfer to paper towels to dry.
- 3. The second round of dipping colors is made by stirring 1 teaspoon vinegar, 10-20 drops of food coloring, and 1 tablespoon oil into each cup of water. For best results, these colors should be darker shades.
- 4. Place one egg in each color and stir to coat. Allow to rest for 1 to 3 minutes. Transfer to paper towels to dry.
- 5. To repeat in a different color, rub as much oil from the eggs as possible before returning to the oil bath. Keep in mind that colors may blend on the eggs.


